"So Shines a good deed... By Chris Gerace

... in a weary world." Many baby boomers will recognize this quote from the 1971 film, "Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory." This quote was inserted into the film's screenplay, but it was not taken from Roald Dahl's book (Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, 1964). The line was actually taken and modified - from Shakespeare's "The Merchant of Venice." The original line was spoken by the character Portia in Act V, Scene I: "*How far that little candle throws his beams, so shines a good deed in a naughty world.*"

Although the original Shakespeare line is not even central to the play's plot, it stands out by itself, and is just as noteworthy as any good deed - no matter how small - in a weary world. I often reflect on this quote, and on how our own church members perform so many good deeds all the time. I would like to share just a few examples of my recent learnings, experiences and observations.

About a month ago, I was talking with a church member, and I mentioned that I had never seen the Mission Impossible films. By that afternoon, this member called me to tell me that she picked up the 5-movie 'box set' for me as a gift. Wow, did I feel the love? You bet your boots I did!

Another church member recently shared with me that he was walking on a street near his place of work, and said "A pleasant good morning to you!" - to two passing women who were apparently visiting from the South. They were stunned, and complimented the 'yankee' for saying a 'friendly hello' to strangers. After a brief interchange of pleasantries, he bid them well by saying "...and a blessed day to you!" This again caught the southern ladies off guard, and they gushed with surprise and joy that this 'northern young man' had religion, and was so gracious as to wish the Lord's blessing

And let's not forget another truth, that performing a good deed doesn't only bless the other, but it spiritually lifts us up as well.

In conclusion, each of us has the calling and the opportunity through our good works, to inspire and further the wonderful giving of time, talents, and treasures... from our church members to each other, and more importantly, to those in our community and beyond. May the Holy Spirit continue to work through us, so that we will continue to reach out and lift up others in this world by our own shining lights, as members of The Light on the Hill. And those that experience and see our good works, hopefully will say, "So shines another good deed, in this weary world." Amen!
