Prayer Pet Peeves - Episode 2:

Oh, for crying out loud!

Overcoming the fear of leading others in prayer

One of the expectations that people tend to have regarding pastors, is that pastors should be the ones to lead others in prayer. Before a church meal or event, at the beginning or end of a meeting or class, all of these are times when people tend to turn their eyes to the pastor with the hope that a prayer will be soon forthcoming.

And there are any number of reasons as to why this expectation centering on clergy exists; that prayer is a privilege we should offer to the pastor, the idea that clergy are natural public speakers, the assumption that the pastor has a deeper prayer vocabulary or connection to God, the fear that some laity have of personal embarrassment by "messing up" a prayer or saying the wrong words, etc...

Even so, the notion that all Christians (not just clergy) should be able to and learn to be confident in leading (continued on page 4)

others in prayer is certainly supported and encouraged by the scriptures. Indeed, as a pastor, it is arguable that I am not fulfilling my call if I am not seeking to empower my Christian brothers and sisters to share in the gift of verbalized communal prayer.

It is for this reason that I am known to ask at staff meetings, committee meetings, and confirmation class, the question, "Do I have a prayer warrior willing to lead us in prayer?"

Now if you ask around, you might hear that in such moments there sometimes comes a dead silence in the room following my request: peoples' eyes begin to shift between one another, and some are careful to avoid mine, lest I interpret it as an unspoken sign that they wish to volunteer. However there are also those times when somebody just jumps right in, much to the delight of the rest of the group.

And I get it; I know that public speaking can be scary, and people can get self-conscious, and it is a bit uncomfortable to feel as if you have been put on the spot for such a monumentous task of speaking to God on behalf of those gathered.

But truth be told, I am so very glad that I continue to push the prayer boundaries in those moments, because it never ceases to amaze me – all the wonderful thoughts and deep insights that the good people of Robeson bring forth in their prayers. From the members of our church staff, and the leaders serving on council, to the people serving on committees and our youth group, there is such a wonderful bounty of prayer that reveals a true passion for serving God and for doing good in our community.

So know this; I will not stop asking for prayer warriors, and there may come a time when you have the honor and opportunity to publicly speak to God on behalf of the rest of us. In such a moment, I encourage you not to be afraid, or nervous, or worried, but to trust that God will provide you the words to speak. Just take your time, remember that you are loved in this place, and listen to
