

LENT 2021

LENT — a time in the church year when we emphasize the preparation of our hearts and lives to receive our crucified and risen Lord.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday — February 17th this year. In the early Christian church, the Lenten season was a time of examination for those candidates who were preparing for their baptisms at the Easter Vigil. The season

is forty days in length (not counting Sundays). Those forty days came to be associated with Jesus' forty days in the desert prior to his temptation and with the forty years the children of Israel spent in the wilderness. Thus, it became a time for every Christian to deepen his/her relationship with their Lord. It is in some ways a solemn time, but also a time of growth in faith and in response to one's baptismal relationship and how that affects how we live our lives in relationship to God, to one another, and to the world around us.

It was early in the Lenten season last year that worship in our church buildings stopped and our experience of the world around us changed drastically. In a sense we, like Jesus and the children of Israel, were suddenly in a desert—a wilderness—as we searched for and found ways to continue our journey to be the body of Christ here in this place. Over the time between then and now we have experienced feelings of chaos and wondering as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic and all that caused in our lives along with the unrest in our nation. Although our church buildings were closed out of concern for the health and well-being of our people, opportunity for worship continued virtually on Sundays with more than 75 households attending, along with educational opportunities and conversation on Wednesdays. Other ministries of outreach through food pantry, Rowdy Seniors, book discussions, angel trees, and various other social ministries continued.

As part of our weekly worship, we now are offering Holy Communion on the second Sunday of the month, and we invite and encourage you to join us for sharing together in God's holy meal on those Sundays. We also invite you to make it a part of your Lenten journey and growth this year to look understanding how God is calling us all to be witnesses of God's good news of grace and love through Jesus Christ. You can do that via Zoom or on your phone each time we gather. (There are persons in each of our congregations that can assist you with doing that.)

Make this Lent a time to join together with one another as we journey through the sometimes wilderness of this life — a life redeemed through Jesus Christ. God's blessings to you.

Update regarding services at Robeson:

Following much discussion regarding the worsening Covid-19 situation in our country, state, and county, our five-church Joint Discernment Team made a recommendation to the Church Councils to encourage our congregations to remain online through the end of April. This recommendation was discussed at our most recent church council meeting, and we will look to follow the recommendation. There may be an opportunity to try an outdoor (parking-lot) style worship service sometime in the early Spring, if there is a turn-around in our numbers of infections, until then, we remain committed to the safety and health of our congregation and community and will maintain our online (and at-home) ministry.

Worship Flexibility for Participation:

Throughout the new year (2021) we will be seeking to offer communion at least once a month (typically on the second Sunday). As we discuss the logistics of providing communion with such frequency, please keep in mind that we do allow and encourage the use of your own personal supplies so that you may participate with us.

Note: Since some struggle with food allergies or lack easy access to grocery shopping, know that any variety of fruit juices or bread types are welcomed to be used for the sake of participation as we believe that such items still reflect the spirit of the common earthly elements that Jesus used with his disciples at the Last Supper.

A monthly Zoom family faith night to begin in March. Plans are underway to include families with children age 3 through Grade 5. If you have a child in this age range and would like to participate please contact Debbie in our church office. Children do not have to be church members. The Joint Worship and Music Committee met last week and discussed plans for the season of Lent including Ash Wednesday and the weekly Lenten services. The committee will meet again via Zoom on March 5th (6pm) to discuss Holy Week and Easter.

The Joint Discernment Team will meet again via Zoom on March 9th (6:00pm) to discuss future planning in light of Covid-19.

Robeson Church Council will meet again via Zoom on February 11th (7pm).

The West Berks Mission District Pastors met via Zoom on January 20th to discuss various mission district issues including the experience of Covid-19's effect on our mission district congregations. Of the 22 participating pastors, almost half have had to do at least one funeral for parishioners who died from Covid-19 complications, and nearly every pastor was able to count multiple families in their own congregations who had been exposed to and infected with Covid-19 (including some of the pastors). The pastors were prayerfully encouraged to remind all parishioners to please continue following the recommendations of the CDC and public health officials – wear a mask, social distance, avoid large indoor gatherings, and maintain good hygiene with lots of hand washing.
